



Asylum applications







- **1993** UNHCR Implementing partner for local settlement of asylum seekers and refugees in Bulgaria
- 1997 Establishment of the Refugee-Migrant Service in BRC HQ, Sofia

Bulgarian Red Cross Law /1995, Article 4 para 6/

Law on Asylum and Refugees

- 2008-2013 Main Partner of the State agency for refugees at the Council of Ministers for the implementation of the National Integration Program for Refugees
- **2018-2020** Pilot project for integration of relocated and resettled families with 4 local municipalities funded by AMIF
- **Since 2021** Pilot project for integration of refugees with 2 local municipalities funded by AMIF National Program

Modus Operandi and Target Groups

- Project based funding
- Main donors/ funding sources: UNHCR, AMIF/ ERF, Swiss Red Cross, Global Fund to Fight HIV/AIDS, Malaria and Tuberculosis trough Ministry of Health, Terre Des 'Homme
- Current staff members: 18 colleagues, divided in 2 teams / Sofia and Haskovo/ + social worker in BRC branch in Sliven
- Outreach work in several languages: Arabic, Farsi, Pashto, Turkish, English, French, German, Bulgarian

There are 3 open type reception facilities and 1 closed type run by State agency for refugees; **RMS of BRS** operates in 3

locations:

- BRC HQs;
- BRC Community Hub;
- BRC municipal information and service office for TCNs




Sliven region

RMS and COVID-19 in 2020-2021



Hotline in 6 languages – **5809** calls; State-funded food programme – **211**families/**529** refugees; hygiene kits to accommodated in detention centres; families/individuals support with CBA + **47** with food vouchers; purchased medicines; refugees in Sofia provided with hygiene items; UAMs provided with clothing









Different types of cash-based intervention



One off financial assistance

BRC can grant one off financial assistance based on the state guaranteed minimal income that is 75 BGN (38 €). Based on the number of family member BRC grants 75 BGN per person

Letter of request/ Personal information

Medical assistance

BRC can purchase prescribed medicines, cover medical consumables, prescribed by a doctor, cover the lab exams fee or any other medically-related expenses. The amount depends on the prescribed medical assistance

Monthly rent assistance BRC can cover one monthly rent of PoCs. The amount depends on the rental contract

Letter of request/ Personal information/ Rental contract Letter of request/ Personal information/ Supporting medical documents (prescription, official medical document etc)

Different types of cash-based intervention



Food vouchers

BRC provided food vouchers to PoCs in need, applying the following criteria: *Single PoCs – 50 BGN (25€) *Family with up to 2 children – 80 BGN (41 €) *Family with 3 or more than 3 children – 120 BGN (61 €)

Letter of request/ Personal information/ Document providing enrollment in school/ List of school books to be purchased stamped and/or signed by the school teacher

Purchase of educational materials

BRC can purchase educational materials mandatory for the grade children are enrolled in and if not provided by the state

Pilot refugee start-up

Include capacity building, empowerment, promotion and seeking additional financial resources. Also, payment of company tax registration, monthly rental, purchase of equipment and/or necessary products etc.

Personal information

Carefully identify and selected refugee start-up propolsals Cash based rapid response in case of disaster situations in three different modalities RED CROSS





 Signed two long – term standing agreements with "Tombou Bulgaria Ltd" and "Bulgarian Postal service" for:

- 500 000 vouchers can be issued for each disaster response operation, accepted in all commercial stores in Bulgaria.

- vouchers can be defined according to the needs of the affected population – e.g. for food; construction materials, hygiene materials and other

- vouchers can have various nominal value

- vouchers have unique number and can be linked to the beneficiary



- Signed long term standing agreement with "Bulgarian Postal service" for:
 - scope: 10-500 000 beneficiaries
 - value of transfers from 5 to 2500 EUR
 - total coverage of all populated locations in Bulgaria
 - accountability: the transfer can be linked to the beneficiary





- Ongoing procedure for signing long term standing agreements with Debit cards operators for:
 - 500 000 debit cards
 - limit of debit card from 5 to 2500 EUR
 - total coverage of all populated locations in Bulgaria
 - easier access of receiving the debit card
 - accountability: the debit card can be linked to the beneficiary
